Reminder: Please read all the information in this leaflet carefully

1. What is Mammogram?

It is a procedure uses x-ray to examine the breast for early detection or screening of breast cancer. This procedure is recommended every 1-2 years for women aged 40 and above.

2. What to expect during mammogram examination?

The breast is compressed using a dedicated mammogram unit. You may feel a little discomfort during this time. Additional view may be taken if necessary.

3. How long does it take to complete a Mammogram examination?

The Mammogram examination generally takes between 20 minutes to 30 minutes.

4. When will breast ultrasound indicated?

Ultrasound is typically used for further evaluation of masses or palpable lumps which is not seen on mammography. It also indicated for women less than 40 years old who have symptoms or lumps in their breast.

Patient Preparation Prior to The Procedure

- You are advised not to apply any deodorant, talcum powder, or lotion on the procedure day.
- You should inform the Medical Officer (MO) or Radiographer know prior to the mammogram procedure if you have :
 - a. any previous surgery done
 - b. Taken hormone therapy tablet/ any supplement.
 - c. Family history of breast cancer
 - d. Other types of cancer diseases
- Please bring any previous mammograms films and report from other hospitals if any for comparison purposes.
- For female patient of child bearing age, the Mammogram will be done 10 days from their 1st menstrual day.
